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Italy Ranking TASTED 100% BLIND by Andreas Larsson

On February 2017, Andreas Larsson, Best Sommelier of the World, had tasted very different wines in several countries.

One of the most important tasting took place in Italy, in the beautiful Franciacorta region and also in Milan, in the prestigious seven stars Town House Galleria Hotel.

Today, we reveal all the Italian results for the more than 600 wines blindtasted.

92 – Points – Ricci Curbastro – Extra Brut Museum Release 2007 – Lombardy – Franciacorta – White
Straw colour verging on light golden, fine bubbles. Complex nose in a vinous style with new oak, vanilla, crushed nuts and butter. The palate has good density with a fine creaminess, bright and fresh all along with barely ripe stone fruit, finely integrated oak, mild spiciness and complex hints of autolys like nougat, long, bright and persistent finish. A vinous style with plenty of character, yet nicely restrained and elegant.

91 – Points – Ricci Curbastro – Extra Brut 2012 – Lombardy – Franciacorta – White
Bright straw colour with a green hue, rather fine mousse. The nose is vinous with autolytic notes, butter, some new oak, crushed nuts, citrus and young stone fruit. Really good grip on the palate, ripe and warm, yet with a fresh bite, a young creaminess, nutty and citrus flavours followed by a long ripe finish. Well made in a rich and vinous style.
